



CRS Rice Bowl Grant Criteria and Guidelines 2024 – 2025

Grant Guidelines

- 1. The deadline for grant applications is **July 5, 2024**. Late applications will not be accepted.
- 2. The grant application form must be completed in full and may be filled out online or mailed. Please email completed applications to the Life, Justice, and Peace office at michael.shirley@dsj.org or mail the application to the Diocese of San Jose, 1150 North First Street, Suite 150, San Jose, CA 95112 Attention: Michael Shirley.
- 3. Applications require a signature by the pastor or principal of the parish or school making the application indicating their approval of the application.
- 4. The local Rice Bowl committee will consider grants between \$250 \$2,500. The amount of the funds granted is determined by factors such as organizational goals and objectives, number of clients served, and current sources and availability of funds.
- 5. All grant applications will be reviewed by a grant allocation committee and approved by the Bishop of San Jose or his designate.
- 6. Grants are made on annual basis and do not imply subsequent years' funding.

Innovation and Sustainability

1. Grants will be awarded **only to parish or school-based programs** addressing hunger and/or poverty alleviation in the County of Santa Clara.

- 2. Preference will be given to <u>new and innovative programs</u> that demonstrate <u>long-term</u>, <u>sustainable solutions to hunger</u> with <u>specific</u>, <u>tangible goals</u>, <u>measurable outcomes</u>, and a <u>specific time frame</u> and which <u>lead to self-sufficiency</u>. Examples might be development of organic gardens that send produce to local panties, school art projects to increase hunger awareness, and education on healthy eating on a limited income, etc.
 - Grants are not given for such things as salaries, equipment, appliances, etc.
- 3. Grants for existing programs must demonstrate an expansion in current programming or a significant crisis which would prevent them from continuing operations.

Engagement with CRS Faith Formation and Solidarity programs

- 1. CRS Rice Bowl Program: The applicant's <u>parish and/or school must have</u> <u>exhibited some level of engagement with the CRS Rice Bowl program</u> in the year prior to applying. Types of engagement include:
 - a. Ordering and distributing Rice Bowls and/or Faith Formation materials.
 - b. <u>Engaging the community</u> (classes prayer groups, catechetical ministries, youth, etc.) in the Faith Formation and solidarity-building aspects of the Rice Bowl program through prayers, bulletin or newsletter information, public displays; inviting Global Fellow to speak, etc.
 - c. <u>Collecting Rice Bowl donations and sending them to the diocese</u> in a timely manner.
 - d. Increasing donations from year to year.
 - e. <u>Finding new ways to engage the community</u> (prayer groups, soup suppers, guest speakers, CRS videos, etc.) to grow solidarity, spread awareness of CRS' work, and/or increase Rice Bowl donations over time.
 - f. Selection, attendance, and training of a Parish Ambassador.

Communication and Reporting

- 1. Quality of Reporting: Organizations currently receiving funding who wish to apply for the next application period must submit an interim report by July 15 (on the current grant) to be considered for funding.
 - Was the interim report submitted on time?
 - Is the interim report <u>adequately detailed and include transparent accounting</u> of the funds received?

- 2. The grant year period is October 1, 2024 September 30, 2025. All grant recipients will submit a final report with a financial statement no later than October 15, 2025.
- 3. Award checks will be payable to parishes and/or schools only and designated for the use of the program. For the purpose of state laws, these funds must be used as intended and any unused funds must be returned. ALL RECEIPTS MUST BE KEPT and photocopies of receipts are to be attached to interim reports and/or final grant reports.
- 4. Grant recipients must submit all requested reports on time and be consistent with communication and updates after each time grant funds are utilized. Acceptable updates include but are not limited to pictures, social media posts, stories from the field, news articles, etc.

For grant awardees, you are to complete an interim Progress Report Form due on **July 15, 2025** and a Final Progress Report Form due on **October 15, 2025**.
